<u>PENALTY BOX</u>	One adult per game (home and away); two per team; should have basic understanding of rules.
<u>SCOREKEEPER</u>	One adult per home game; two per team; pre-season instruction will be provided.
<u>TIMER</u>	One adult per home game; three per team; pre-season instruction will be provided.
<u>JERSEY MAINTENANCE</u>	Washing, sewing, delivery to each game; two per team.
<u>OLD BOYS GAME/ HOLIDAY PARTY</u>	Help with December 21 st evening event; two per team.
<u>RECOGNITION PICNIC</u>	Help with April event; two per team.
<u>VIDEO CAMERA</u>	Use video camera provided by club to tape home games; four per team; each tapes three games.
<u>COMMUNITY SERVICE</u>	Work with club's coordinator in executing various activities; two per team.
<u>MANAGER</u>	One of the most important jobs in the program. Run the administrative side, interface with coaches, players, parents and General Manager. Ability to organize and to listen well; some previous hockey experience would be an advantage. Often a good manager makes the difference in the outcome of the season. One per team; pre-season direction and guidance will be provided. Sets up and oversees team "bank". Manager is "affirmed" by team head coach and TCE general manager. Receives \$150 from TCE.
<u>PUBLICITY</u>	Provide press releases to local newspapers; work with overall coordinator and other team publicists; provide information for Web site; one per team.
<u>FUNDRAISING</u>	Work with manager to create "slush fund" to pay for tournaments, post-season play, coaches, gifts, etc; two per team.
<u>SCHEDULER</u>	Schedule non-CBHL games, working with head coach and manager.
<u>STATISTICS/YEARBOOK</u>	Gather game statistics, particularly <u>each</u> game sheet; one per team.
<u>CBHL VOLUNTEER</u>	Assists in CBHL playoffs, two per team.
<u>ACADEMIC COUNSELOR</u>	Arrange educational activities for away games, two per team.
<u>TEAM WEBSITE</u>	Sets up and keeps current team website, one per team.
<u>HOST SUMMER GET- TOGETHER</u>	Two per team. Gather the players, siblings, and coaches to get to know each other

PLAYER'S CODE OF CONDUCT

Play for FUN. Enjoy yourself. Be proud of being an Eagle.

WORK HARD to improve your skills. Listen, ask questions, and watch others to see how you can better yourself.

Be a TEAM PLAYER – get along with your teammates. Appreciate the contribution each person makes to the team.

Learn TEAMWORK, SPORTSMANSHIP, and DISCIPLINE.

Be on time for practices and games, and be both mentally and physically prepared at the start of each practice and game.

Learn the rules, and play by them. Always be a GOOD SPORT and set a positive example for others, particularly younger players.

RESPECT your coach, your teammates, your parents, opponents and officials. Never do anything that in any way makes another person feel badly about him/herself.

Never argue with the official's decision.

Learn to lose with DIGNITY and to win with GRACE.

Appropriate behavior

- **At the sound of each whistle, immediately stop play. Failure to do so will result in benching for that practice. Repeated infractions will result in dismissal from the team.**
- **SMOKING, DRINKING ALCOHOL, OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE DURING ANY TEAM FUNCTION WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE DISMISSAL FROM THE TEAM.**
- **Any behavior that reflects poorly on the team during any official team function will result in immediate disciplinary action as decided by the coaches and/or Discipline Review Committee.**
- **Unexcused lateness or absence may result in automatic benching. Communicate with your coaches in advance.**

PARENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

Do not force your children to participate in sports, but support their desires to play their chosen sport. Children are involved in organized sports for their enjoyment; make it fun.

Encourage your child to play by the rules. Remember, children learn best by example, so applaud the good plays of both teams.

Do not be critical of the hockey program or other players in front of your children. If you have a problem, speak directly to the coach or to the Administrator.

Do not embarrass your child or the Eagles organization by verbally abusing or insulting players, coaches, other parents, or officials. By showing a positive attitude toward the game and all of its participants, your child will benefit.

Emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit your young athlete. De-emphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.

Know and study the rules of the game, and support the officials on and off the ice. This approach will help in the development and support of the game. Any criticism of the officials only hurts the game.

Applaud a good effort in victory and in defeat and enforce the positive points of the game. Never yell at or physically abuse your child after a game or practice – it is destructive. Work toward removing the physical and verbal abuse in youth sports.

Recognize the importance of volunteer coaches. They are important to the development of your child and the sport. Communicate with them and support them.

If you enjoy the game, learn all you can about the game, and volunteer!

Be positive to all players, coaches, referees, and parents. Welcome visiting teams and treat them as you would like to be treated.

Remember that one of the benefits of youth activities is the opportunity that the youngsters have to get to know other adults. Be interested in the players; ask questions. Congratulate them on their effort and achievements.

Since you are spending a lot of time with fellow parents, treat others, as you would like to be treated. Don't criticize players.

Should I violate the Parents' Code of Conduct after receiving a warning, I agree to leave the rink and to stay away the rest of the season.
